## Communication

We also take the constructive criticism seriously, so thank you for being candid. Communication was highlighted as an area we need to work on improving. Since the survey we have relaunched our two Facebook pages as parents said this was a good way to see messages. We are keeping reminders

and 'in house' messages on our private page, whereas celebrations and photos (of those we have permission for), are shared on our public page.
