Year Six SATs

This week has been a busy time for our Year Six pupils. On Tuesday they completed a spelling and a grammar and punctation test, on Wednesday a reading test and on Thursday and Friday the three maths tests. These tests are designed to assess all that has been taught across the primary maths and English curriculums, not just reciting knowledge learnt but applying their skills to unfamiliar texts, questions and problems. Phil Whitley oversaw the tests on Tuesday and Wednesday and I oversaw them on Thursday and Friday. There is a very strict process of timing and allowed support, and we are not allowed to peek at the papers before the tests! I can assure you that these were administered correctly by our staff and all children abided by the rules. We do not get the results until July as these test papers are sent off to be externally marked.

Year Two SATs

Next week Year Two will complete their tests. This is done in a very different way as the children can do these in small groups over a period of time. The tests are marked internally and will be published in the children's individual teacher report which parents will receive at the end of the year.

Coronation Celebrations

Last week, we had a fabulous Friday afternoon celebrating the King's coronation. We all went over to the field where the staff led welly wanging, rounders and parachute games. The children were in their mixed age houses and had great fun. I was so impressed to see older children really looking after the younger ones and being so kind and cooperative.


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Final Thoughts and Reflections
