Dear Parents and Carers,

What a great start to term the children have had! All classes have settled well back into the learning routine and are enjoying their new subject units. I know Class 1 are loving learning about space in science, Class 2 are enthralled by writing their own playscripts based on the ancient Greeks and Class 3 are enjoying having in depth and mature discussions regarding the civil rights movement in America as part of their history unit.

School Improvement Update – Proud Achievement Wall:

At the start of term, the children were challenged to have some of their amazing learning from the week added to our new 'Proud Achievement Wall' in between the library and hall. We are delighted that some of the children's work has been selected and is now on display due to them being proud of their work as well as members of staff. The children's work is chosen by them showing one or more of the following key learning attitudes - perseverance, resilience, enthusiasm, passion and cooperation. The children are very keen to get their work on the 'Proud Achievement Wall' and it is great to hear other children also celebrating with them when their work has been put on display. Additionally, I have also asked Nicholas Bryant (music teacher) to lead a Friday singing assembly with the whole school. Each term, he will be teaching the children new songs: some traditional and some modern. The first song he is teaching them is the song 'What have you done today to make you feel proud?' to link in with the new proud achievement wall.



Devon Wildlife Trust:

Some children from Class 2 and 3 have been chosen to become Devon Wildlife Trust Champions for the Spring and Summer term. The children met with Sarah (Devon Wildlife Trust Learning Officer) last week to discuss the project they want to complete. They have chosen to focus on looking after the wildlife in our local community and to reduce the pollution in our oceans. The children will spend some time working together on this project and will be visiting the local area to audit the local wildlife and researching how we can all reduce the pollution in our oceans.

Safeguarding Update:

Like all schools in the Trust, we were asked to write an Anti-Harmful Sexual Behaviour Charter with the children this half term. I spoke to many of the older children in school and together we linked this charter with our school values. The children thought that our value of RESPECT was the one that was most important when thinking about anti-harmful sexual behaviour. RESPECT is also the value which we will be focussing on this half term. Together, the children and I wrote the charter which is below and I discussed this all the children during our assembly time on Monday. Posters are also displayed around school to remind children about respecting other people and their decisions. The charter also reminds children of the PANTS rule that is regularly shared and referred to during PSHE lessons. Year 3 residential

We are very excited to confirm arrangements for the Year 3 residential. All year 3s from the Moorland Hub and Ruby Hub – Boasley Cross, Bridestowe, Exbourne, Lydford, Northlew, Bridgerule, Black Torrington, Bradford and Highampton Primaries – will take part in 2 days of adventurous outdoor activity with overnight camping at Boasley Cross Primary School on the 8th and 9th of June. Children will take part in climbing, low ropes, team building games, archery, crate stack and grass sledging. They will return to Boasley Cross for games and camp fire before camping in DMAT tents. Food will be provided by the Trust. This will be a brilliant opportunity to meet children from other local schools – we are expecting 43 children to attend. This exciting opportunity will be subsidised by the school's PE budget, meaning a cost of just £30 to parents. There will shortly be further information by letter and a request for payment to confirm your child's place.

Year 4/5 residential

We are finalising details of the Year 4/5 residential for the summer. This is taking slightly longer than hoped as we are keen to keep the cost affordable for parents and we are negotiating the best price. We will have 3 days, 2 nights of outdoor adventurous activity and are expecting an absolute maximum cost to parents of £120. We will give as much notice as possible so that families can budget this cost.

Neuroscience is the study of the brain and its impact on behaviour.

Course Information

Course delivery:

- This is very much tailored to the individual. The online tutor will work with learners on an individual basis, so there are no set "taught" sessions for the learners to attend.
- All work is supplied on the learning platform and learners can have calls and teams' meetings with their tutor to support with progress.
- Completion time is 12-20 weeks dependent on learner ability (this is accessible 24/7 online)
- learners WILL have a virtual exam at the end to complete their qualification and will be allowed one free resit per qualification
- For any subsequent resits, the learner will be charged the examination administration fee plus the Examination Board fee (handled by Eastleigh College)

Eligibility Criteria:

- Does not have a GCSE C or above already in the chosen subject (example, if you have a B in English, you would not be able to access this)
- Over the age of 19 as of 31st August 2022, and have lived in UK for the past three years with a Valid Passport or Driving License
- Not currently be enrolled onto any other gov funded course.
