#### School Improvement Update – Assessment Week:

Last week, all children across the school completed an assessment week. Year 2 and 6 practised the Standards Assessment Tests (SATs) in reading and maths. Years 1, 3, 4 and 5 completed the Nuffield Foundation for Educational Research (NFER) reading assessment and White Rose maths assessment. The staff have marked and analysed the children's scores and have adapted their plans and teaching

accordingly to ensure their teaching is covering any gaps in knowledge or understanding from the assessment tests. The children did amazingly well and tried their best on each assessment which we are really proud of them for. Year 2 and 6 pupils have also been given some extra guidance on how to read each question carefully and to check how many marks each question is worth.

#### <u>Safeguarding Update – Trust safeguarding data:</u>

This term, all Principals in the Trust have had to analyse their safeguarding data for any patterns or themes. Once this was completed, the information was shared with all staff and our Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) lessons have been planned to address the patterns and themes that have arisen.
