It has been a reflective start to the term with the news of the passing of HRH Queen Elizabeth II. We express our deepest sympathies for the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Exbourne and Jacobstowe parishes will hold a Special Commemoration Service marking the death of her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth on Sunday 18th September at 11 a.m. in St Mary's Church Exbourne.



We will observe the national holiday on Monday 19th September for Her Majesty's funeral, which means school will be closed on that day, but outside of this, school hours will continue as normal. Curriculum news

This term, we see the return of Mrs V Jordan to teach French, Mr W Pugh, our PE specialist, Mrs Jolliffe teaching Music and Mrs Davis teaching Drama. 


Swimming sessions have begun well at our local pool, Aquastars Academy of Swimming where we will be improving pupils' water confidence and swimming ability over the Autumn on a Tuesday afternoon.

Reminder: Pupils can come into school in their PE kit on a Tuesday, with their swimming kit in a separate bag. We have a PE session with Mr Pugh in the morning followed by swimming in the afternoon. An active day for all!

Reading at home

All children have been issued with a Reading Record and will be bringing their reading books between home and school. Shared reading is an excellent way to develop children's language and communication as well as boost their reading skills. Try to create a regular reading routine at home so that the children can continue to practice the skills we are teaching in school – from Phonics and early fluency through to summarising and making predictions about a text in KS2. Please ensure that your child(ren) has their reading record and book with them every day. Many thanks for your support with Reading.





We continue to follow the Read Write Inc programme for reading fluency as well as Guided Reading sessions and extra reading with an adult for those children who need extra practice. Reading unlocks many doors and enables children to access all of our learning areas.

MUSIC LESSONS: We are pleased to tell parents that we will be offering peripatetic music lessons in piano, violin, viola and cello with Mr Nick Bryant on a Thursday in school. Please come along to Nick's Music assembly for children and parents to sample his talent on Thursday 22nd September at 3pm in the hall.

Probably best known for reaching the semi-finals of Britain's Got Talent 2016 with the Collaborative Orchestra Nick Bryant has over 10 years experience as a piano, violin and singing teacher. Nick teaches the ABRSM and Trinity syllabuses (as well as students who don't want to take exams) and music theory. He is also an experienced choir leader and teaches in North Tawton Primary. Nick teaches all ages and abilities. The emphasis is that music

lessons are fun, encouraging and delivered with a caring teaching style. For violin lessons I can also help with buying or hiring of equipment.

- PE kits can be worn into school on Tuesdays, with swimming kits either worn underneath (to ease changing) or in a separate bag.
