


Personal, Social, Emotional Development:

Throughout the summer term, we will be thinking about how we can care for the environment and the world around us. This will include looking at recycling and how pollution can damage our oceans. We will also be focusing on the Exbourne golden rules throughout the term. We will observe and record the children's progress in their Learning Journal.

Literacy:

To develop our reading and writing skills we will begin linking letters and sounds through daily phonics sessions. The children will have opportunities to explore books within the classroom. Writing opportunities will be available within the children's play.



Understanding the World:

We will be learning about beaches, the sea, sand and rockpools. We will be talking about some of the things we might see such as plants, animals and natural objects. We also be learning about water and sun safety and how to stay safe at the beach.



Communication and Language:

This term we will be using language to imagine and re-create roles and experiences in play. This will include our own experiences of visits to the beach and aquariums. Following on from exploring books on a daily basis we will also be encouraging children to use stories and narratives in their play. Through the use of peer and whole class work the children will continue to develop their language.

Expressive Art and Design:

In art and design, we will be developing a wide range of art and design techniques including collage, pattern and texture. In music, we will be using instruments to understand pitch and performing our own pitch pattern to accompany a song.



Mathematics:

In Maths we will be building numbers beyond 10 using a variety of representations. We will count beyond 10 and look at the different patterns. We will use numicon and other concrete resources to practice addition and subtraction as well as doubling, sharing and grouping.
